DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITY

The New Orleans Summer Cancer Meeting (NOSCM) is the largest continuing medical education (CME) event in the US Southeast region. It is a 3-day national CME and nursing education (CE) meeting designed for medical oncologists, hematologists, surgical oncologists, radiation oncologists, oncology nurses, nurse practitioners, pharmacists, physician assistants, residents and fellows in Hematology/Oncology as well as other healthcare professionals involved in the management of cancer patients.

The 13th Annual NOSCM will have a long list of experts in the field of malignant diseases; 44 guest faculty will discuss important topics in the management of cancer patients not only treatments and management of side effects but also survivorship, legislation and reimbursement, medical marijuana and other supportive of care, and implementation of technology such as stereotactic body radiotherapy, interventional radiology, and others. In 2018, the meeting will have simultaneous sessions running in parallel, one track for physicians and the other one for nurses. The meeting will have deep discussions on immunotherapy for different tumor types. Immunotherapy has changed the treatment paradigm of many cancers; nowadays, another unmet has surged. How to deal with progression after immunotherapy. Hence, novel combinations and ongoing research will be discussed during the symposium. Based on evaluations from the previous 12 consecutive years, this meeting will provide the healthcare professionals taken care of cancer patients with the necessary tools to offer the best quality of care to their patients.

The 13th edition of this national CME/CE program will focus on integrating major advances in basic sciences and how to apply them into the routine clinical practice, and hence, deliver customized therapy to each individual patient. In 2018, the Educational Committee decided to include topics such as thyroid/thymic carcinoma (new), gynecologic malignancies due to new indications in 2017, geriatric oncology (new), oral cancer (new), thrombosis in the oncologic patient (new), kidney cancer, esophageal & stomach carcinomas (new), medical use of marijuana (new), and chemoembolization/radiofrequency ablation in oncology (new). The hematology session in 2018 will have the participation of renowned hematologists who will cover the major hematologic malignancies including T- and B-lymphomas in two different tracks as there have been many new indications in 2017, myeloma, CLL, CML, MDS, and leukemias (both AML and ALL) and lymphomas (non-Hodgkin's and Hodgkin's Disease). The length of the NOSCM allows plenty of time for the audience to discuss in depth different topics in medical oncology and hematology, and share their thoughts with national and international leaders in the field of lung cancer, breast cancer, melanoma, gastrointestinal carcinomas, biliary tract/pancreas, genitourinary malignancies, gynecologic malignancies, head and neck cancer, supportive of care as well as many hematologic malignancies previously described. The group of guest faculty is represented by expert clinicians and researchers from premier cancer centers in the United States. The most relevant clinical and investigational data presented at major congresses such as the 2018 American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO), the 2018 American Association for Cancer Research (AACR), the 2017 American Society of Hematology (ASH), the 2017 European Society of Medical Oncology, the 2017 San Antonio Breast Cancer Symposium, and the 2017 World Lung Cancer Conference will be

presented and discussed in this forum.

- Learn and apply state-of-the-art management to the oncologic patient: precision medicine, supportive of care, medical marijuana, and survivorship program.
- Understand the challenges for oncology practices in 2018: legislation and reimbursements.
